- **January Monthly Tips**
 - **Check to make sure that paradichlorobenzene (PDB) crystals in stored frames haven't evaporated.**

- Check the weight of the top box every other week. Feed if needed.
- Only go into hives on warm sunny days. Preferably 65 degrees or higher outside temperatures
Check honey and pollen stores.
- Weak hives (fewer than two frames of bees) should be combined with strong hives.
- If you are planning to make spring splits begin feeding pollen patties or dry pollen in late January
- Colonies should have little or no brood.
- Order equipment and bees.
- Clean tools and make equipment repairs
